- What are the three or four most important points we need to get across? 1) Something will happen, regardless. 2) How the decision-making process will occur (community participation, etc.) 3)Cost-factor, Experience has shown it is less expensive to tear down and build surface alternative than to rebuild (Milwaukee, can we obtain DOT figures?) Cost of repair of bridges v. surface road should be a part of figures in addition to cost of building viaduct or at grade roadway. The question is who bears the cost and it goes back to the point that locally the cost of that additional maintenance is carried in opportunity costs, maintenance dollars go to viaduct maintenance instead of other key projects. 4) Economic Development opportunities/the University Hill economic engine/Downtown connectivity point
